BC Residents' Public Perceptions:
COVID-19 Travel and Tourism
Wave 35: September 15, 2021

Report prepared by Insights West

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BACKGROUND



- Destination BC is monitoring British Columbian’s current views on travel and tourism as well as tracking travel and tourism behaviour intentions in order to understand the impact of COVID-19 on the tourism industry.
- As such, Destination BC has commissioned Insights West to conduct a number of waves of research, one approximately every two weeks, starting May 13, 2020 to track opinions and intentions and watch how results trend over time.
- Note that some changes and additions were made to the questions in a couple of waves to continue to fully meet the research needs of the project.

METHODOLOGY

- Online survey with at least 800 British Columbian adults via an omnibus (shared study).
- Data is weighted by age, gender, region and past voting behaviour to ensure it is representative of the province.

KEY HIGHLIGHTS – WHAT’S NEW OR CHANGED



TRAVEL INTENTIONS (SLIDES 6-10)

- British Columbians’ intent to travel within BC decreased this wave, continuing a downward trend over the last two waves that is likely in part due to seasonal shifts.
 - BC residents’ intent to travel in BC for a day trip in the next 4 weeks decreased -9 points to 53%. This metric stood at 57% at this same time period in 2020. Intent to travel for a day trip in the next 2-3 months decreased -9 points to 71%. This metric stood at 75% at this same time period in 2020.
 - BC residents’ intent to travel in BC for an overnight trip in the next 4 weeks decreased -9 points to 27%. This metric stood at 31% at this same time period in 2020. Intent to travel in BC for an overnight trip in the next 2-3 months decreased -9 points to 49%. This metric stood at 51% at this same time period in 2020.
- BC residents intent to travel to other provinces is down slightly this wave, but is higher than last year at this time – decreasing -3 points to 8% in the next 4 weeks and decreasing -5 points to 21% in the next 2-3 months. These metrics stood at 7% and 17%, respectively, at this same time period in 2020.
- BC residents intent to travel to the US or other countries remains low, as it was in both the previous wave and the same time last year.

CONCERN WELCOMING VISITORS (SLIDES 11-16)

- BC residents’ concern welcoming visitors from all areas remained largely unchanged this wave, with the exception of welcoming visitors from other provinces which increased +4 points to 71%.
 - Asked every two waves (four weeks), concern welcoming visitors from specific provincial regions has increased from Wave 33.
 - Concern rose for welcoming visitors from Alberta (+7 points to 76%), Ontario (+2 points to 71%), Quebec (+3 points to 71%), Manitoba/Saskatchewan (+8 points to 70%), Atlantic Canada (+4 points to 56%), and the Territories (+10 points to 53%).

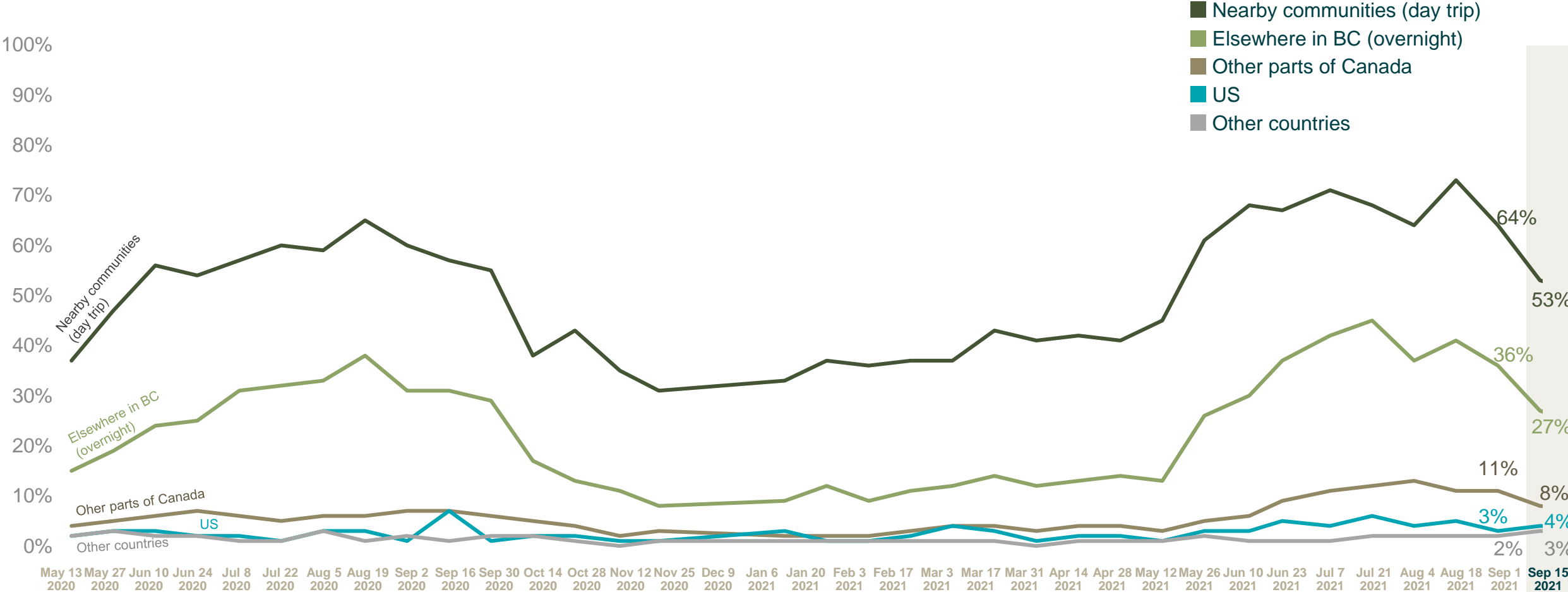
COMFORT WITH ACTIVITIES/MODES OF TRANSPORTATION (SLIDES 17-21)

- Comfort levels with most activities has not significantly changed from two weeks ago, but there is a slight downward trend on this metric overall during the past three waves (6 weeks). Most notably this wave:
 - Comfort staying at a hotel/motel decreased -5 points to 63%.
 - Comfort staying at shared economy accommodations decreased -5 points to 48%.
- Comfort with levels with various activities has generally increased since this same time period in 2020. Some notable examples:
 - Comfort flying in airplane for non-essential travel increased +21 points to 41%, compared to the same time period in 2020.
 - Comfort with visiting an indoor tourist attraction increased +17 points to 57%, compared to the same time period in 2020.

(By Destination)

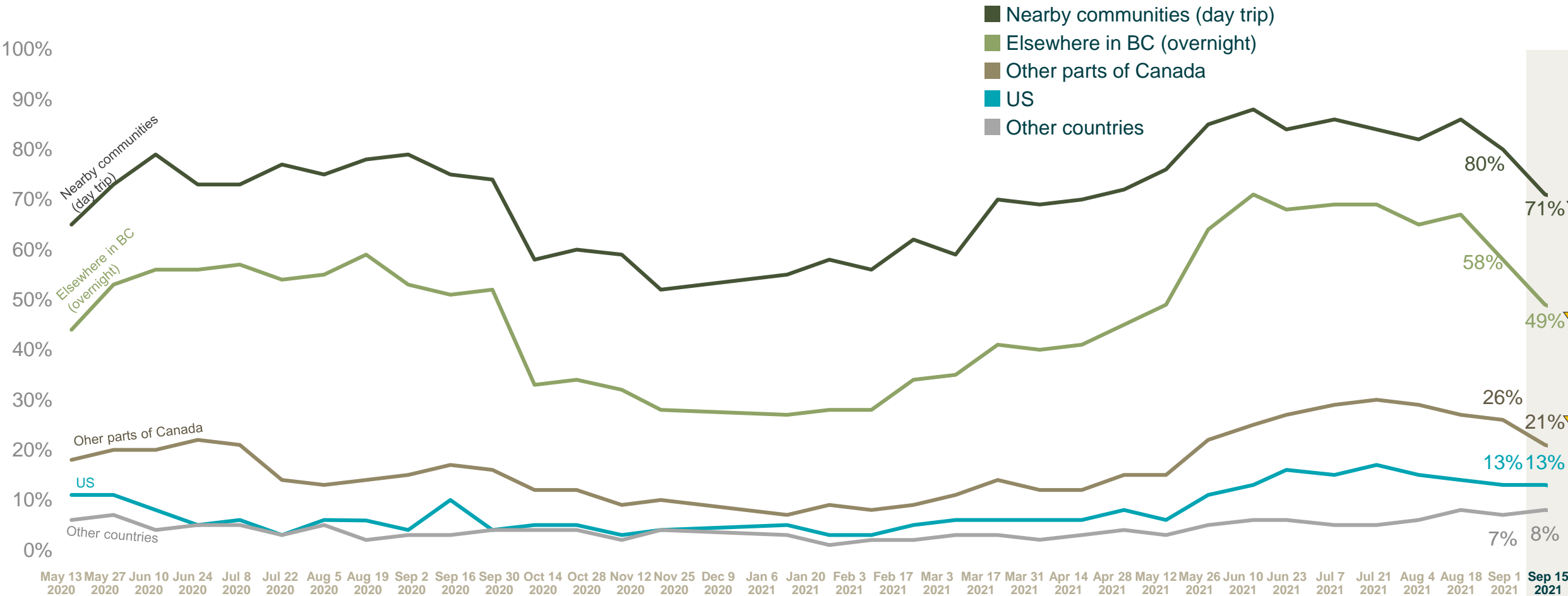

(By Destination)

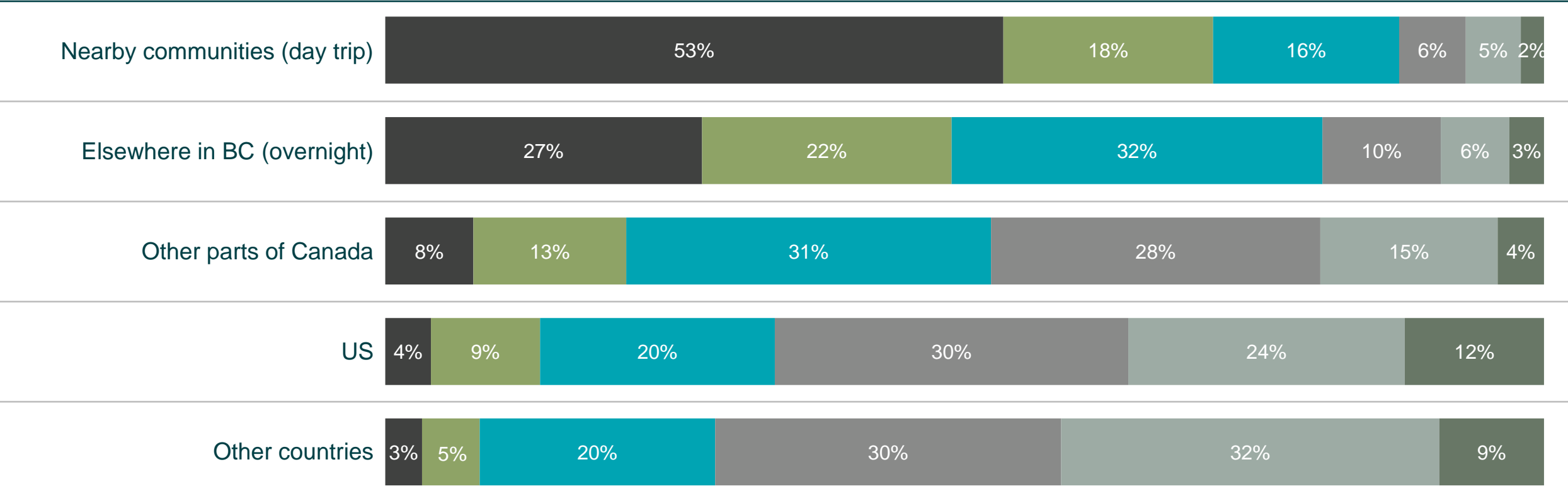

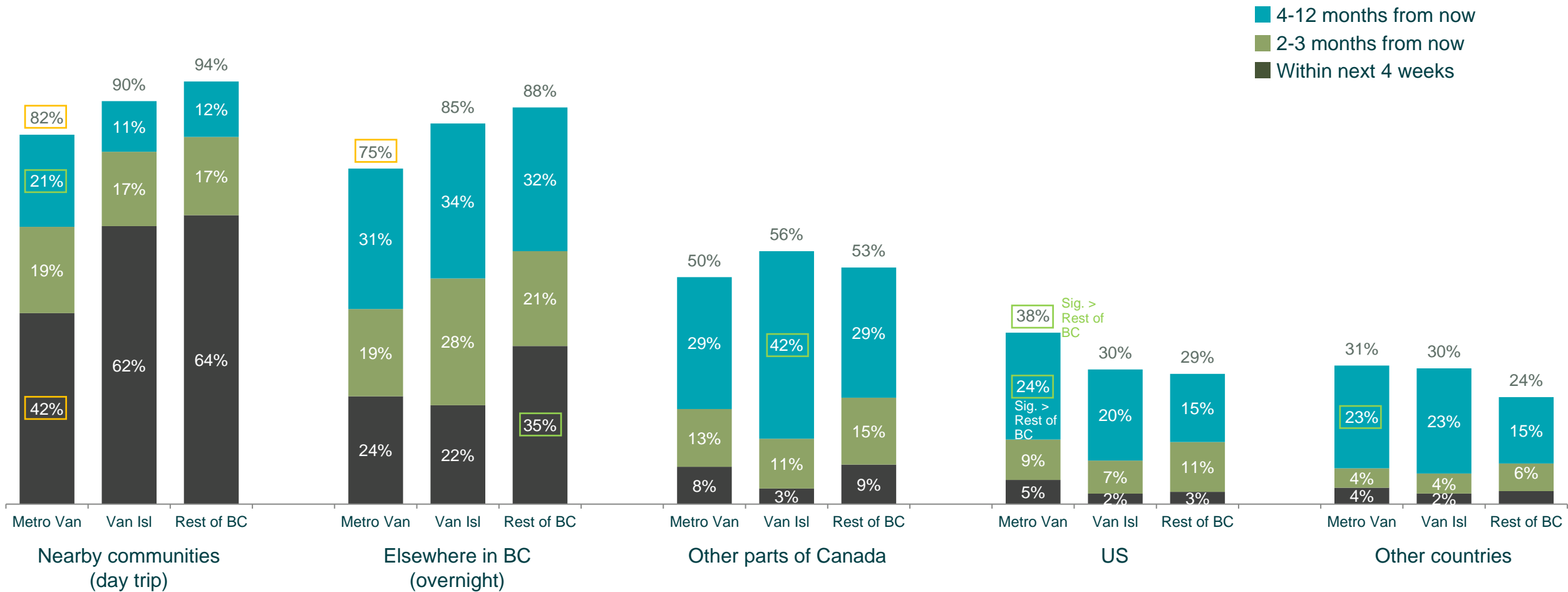

(Wave 35 – Sept 15, 2021)



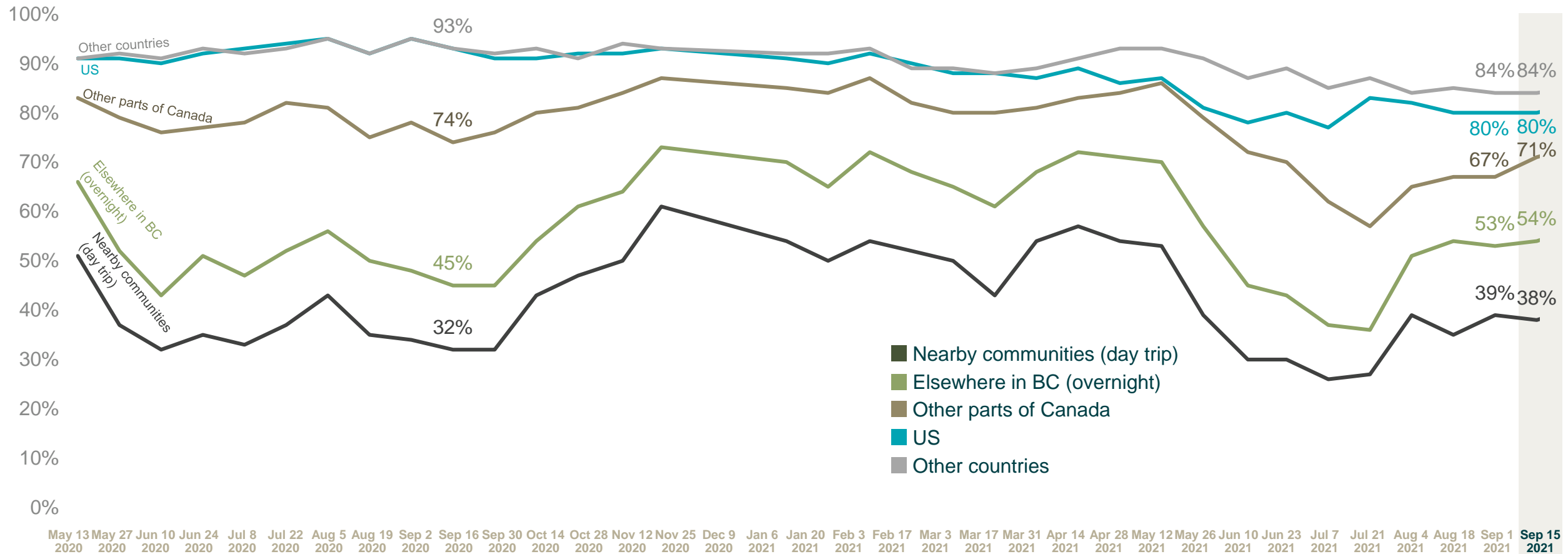

(Total Very/Somewhat Concerned By Visitor Origin)

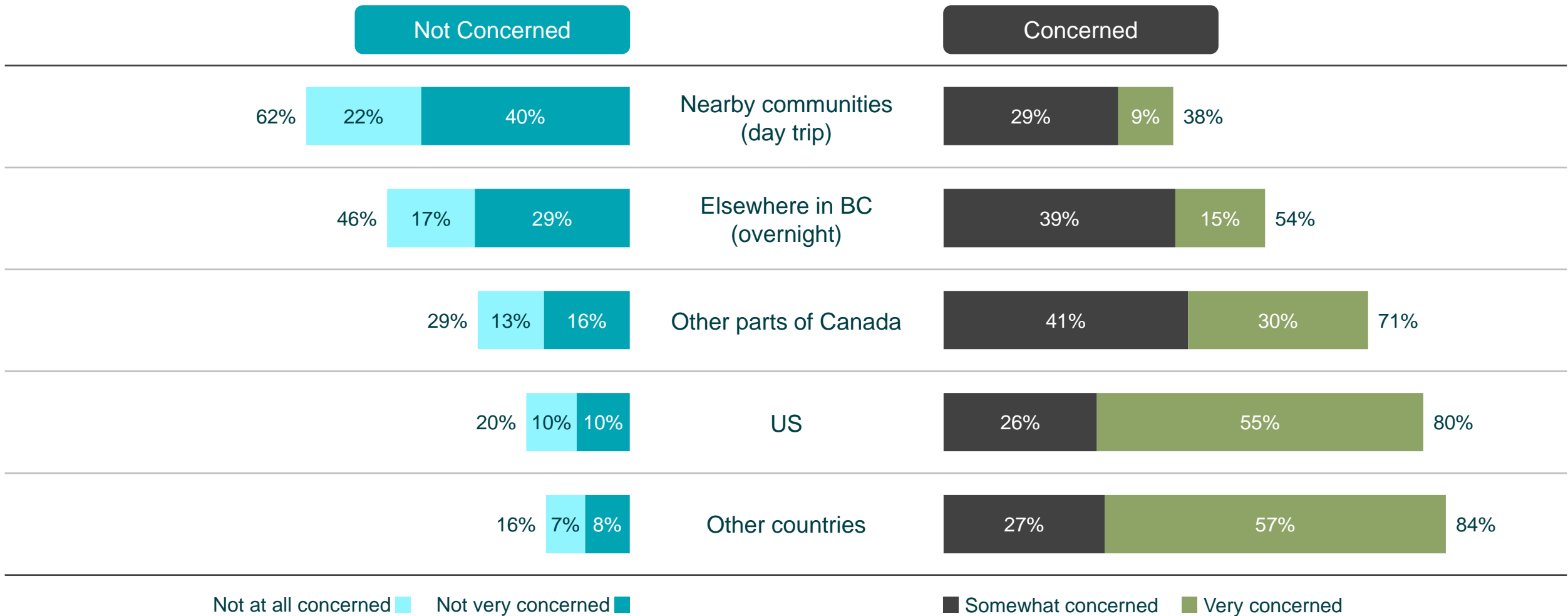

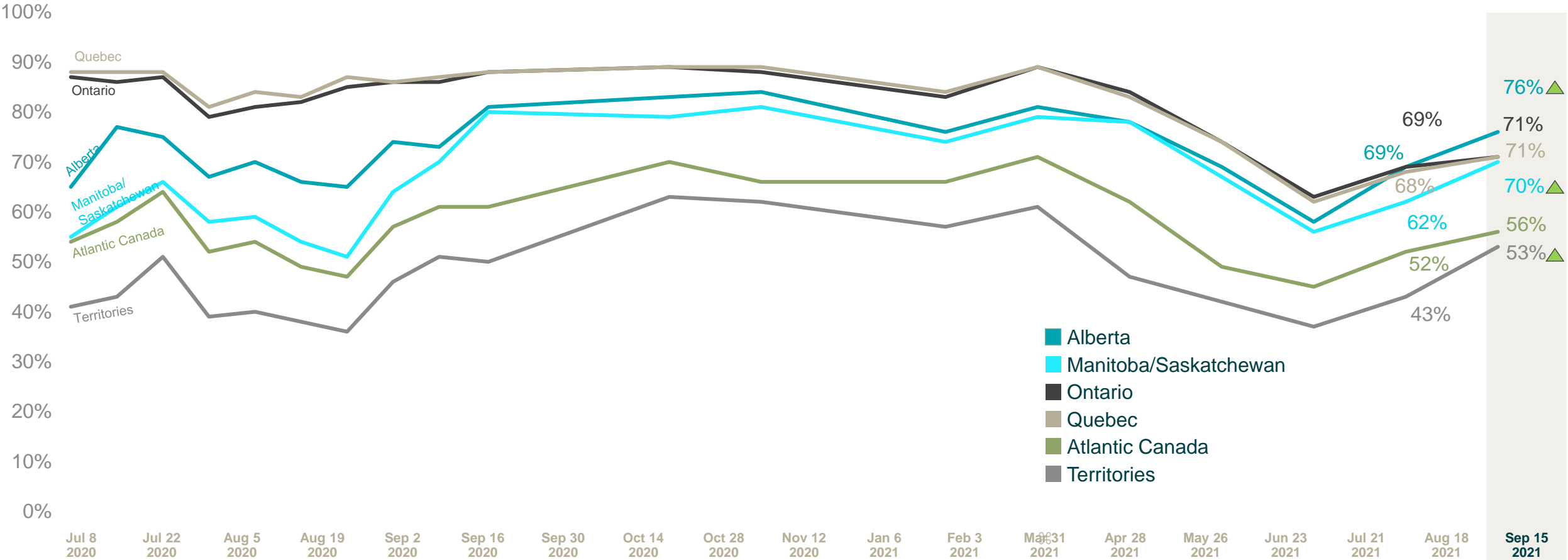

(Total Very/Somewhat Concerned By Origin)

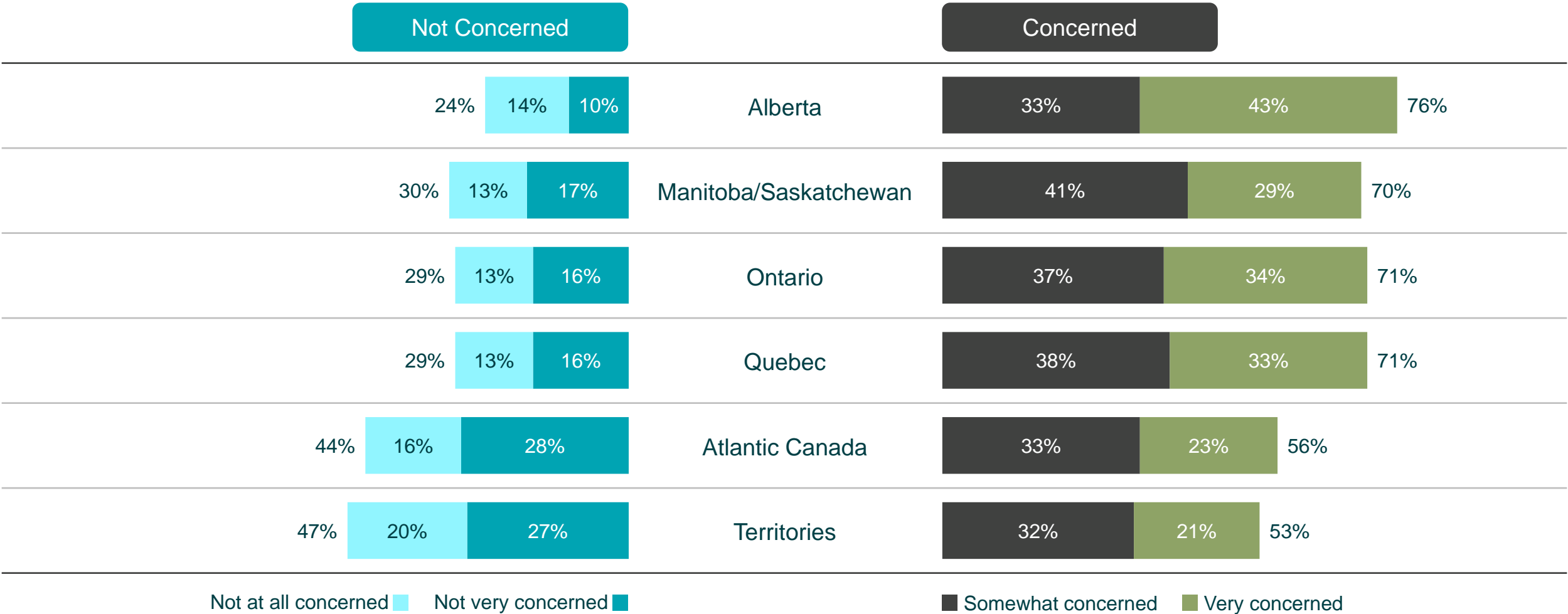

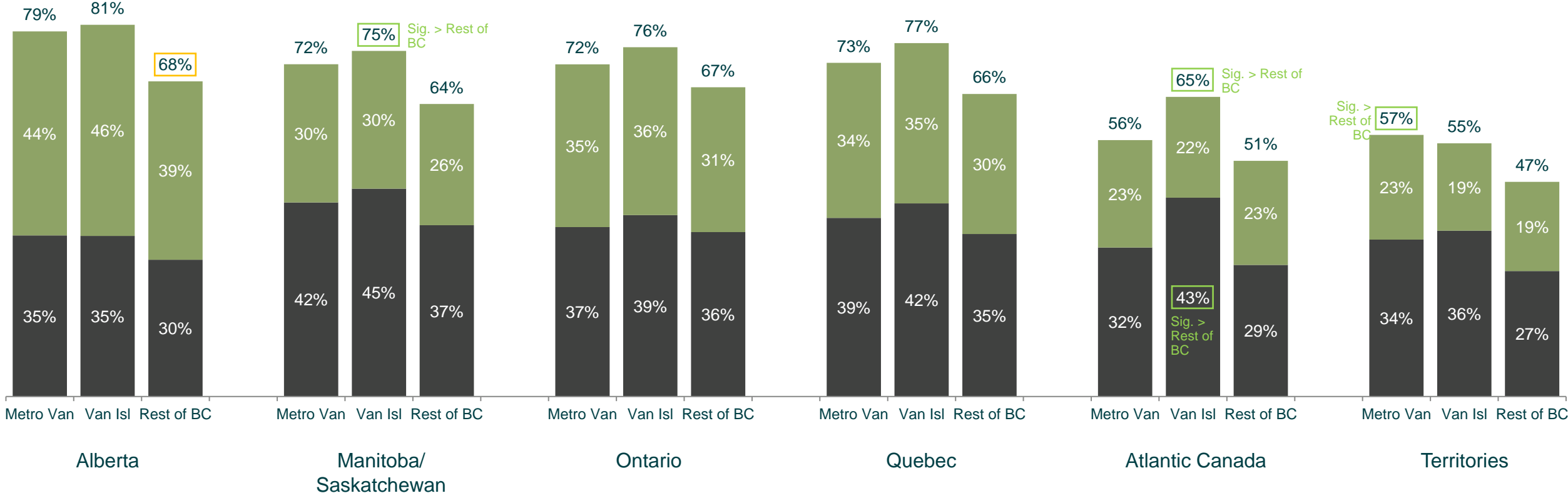

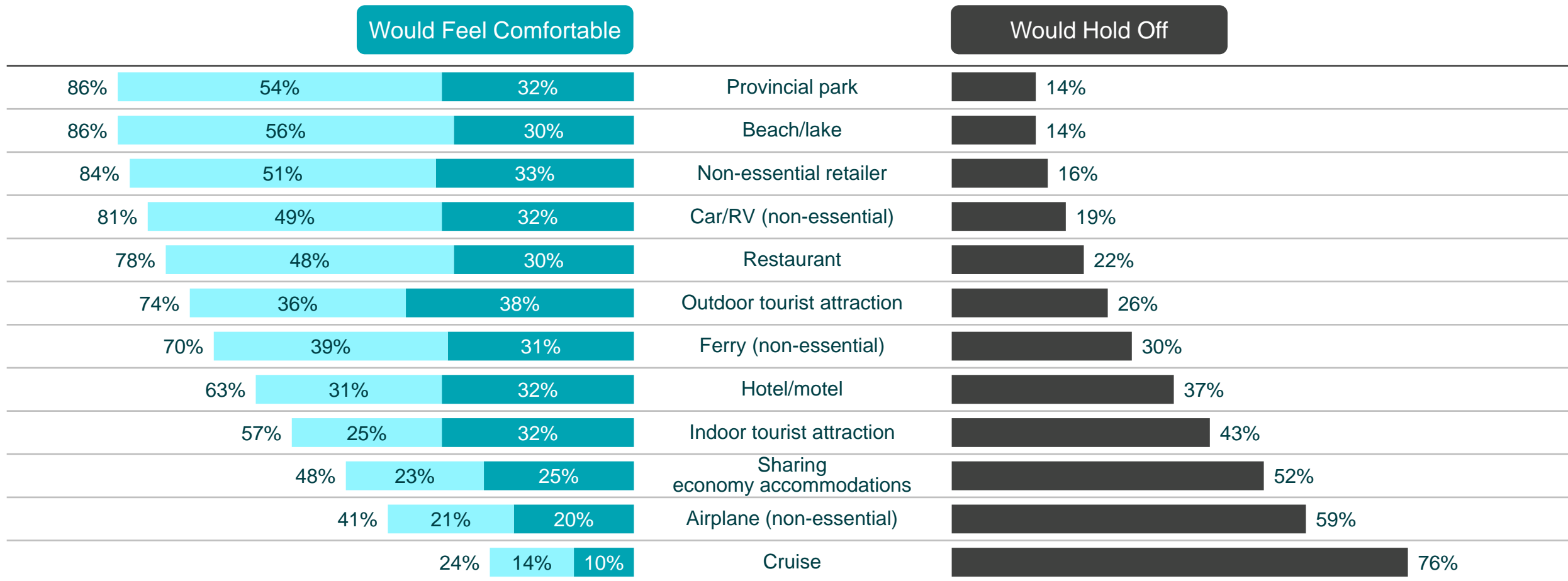

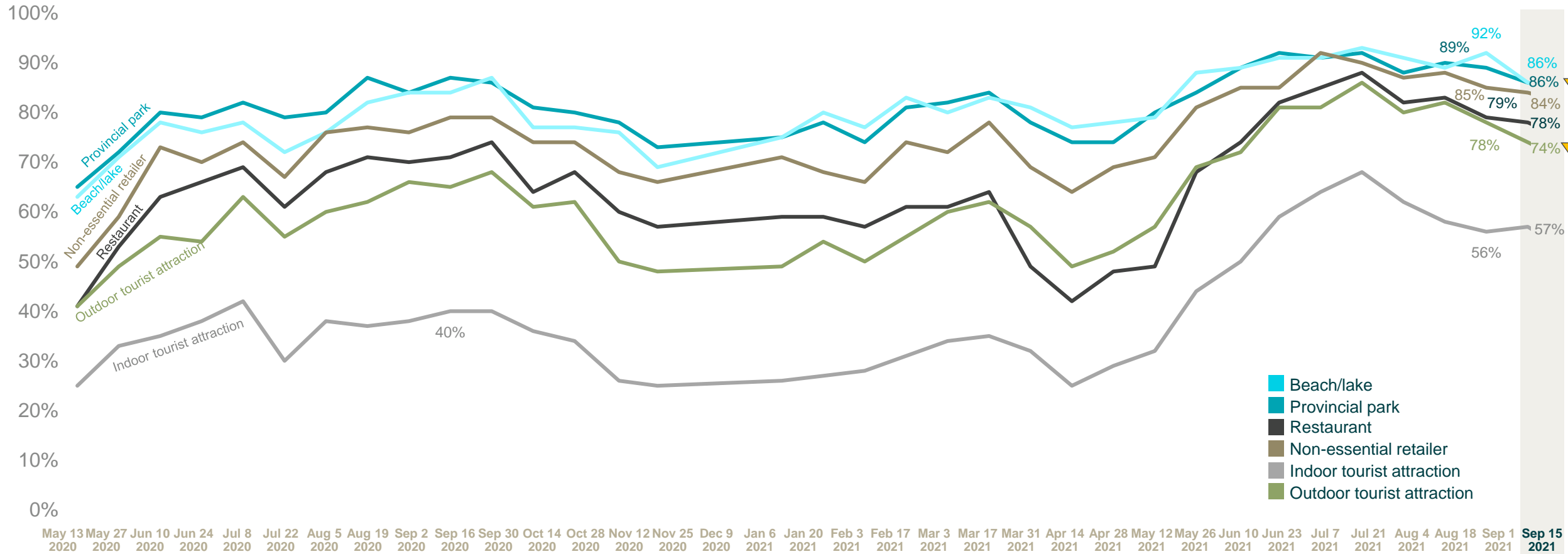

Tracking British Columbians' Comfort Levels With Activities



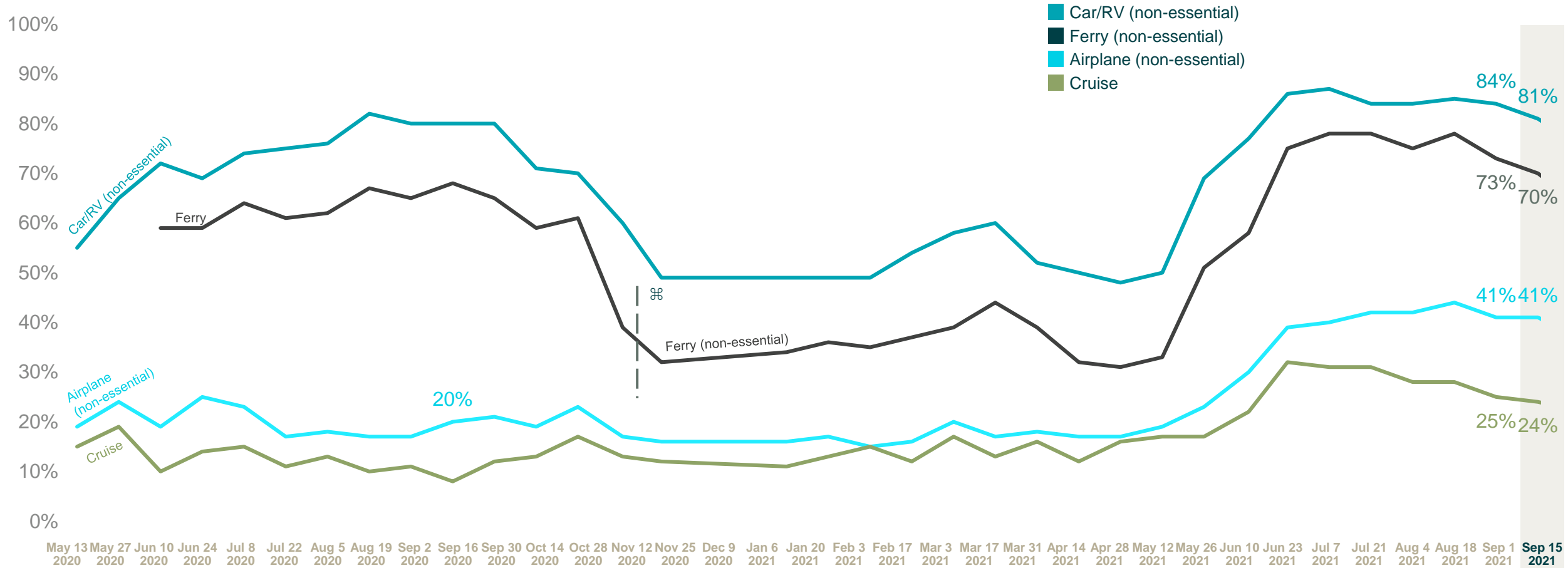

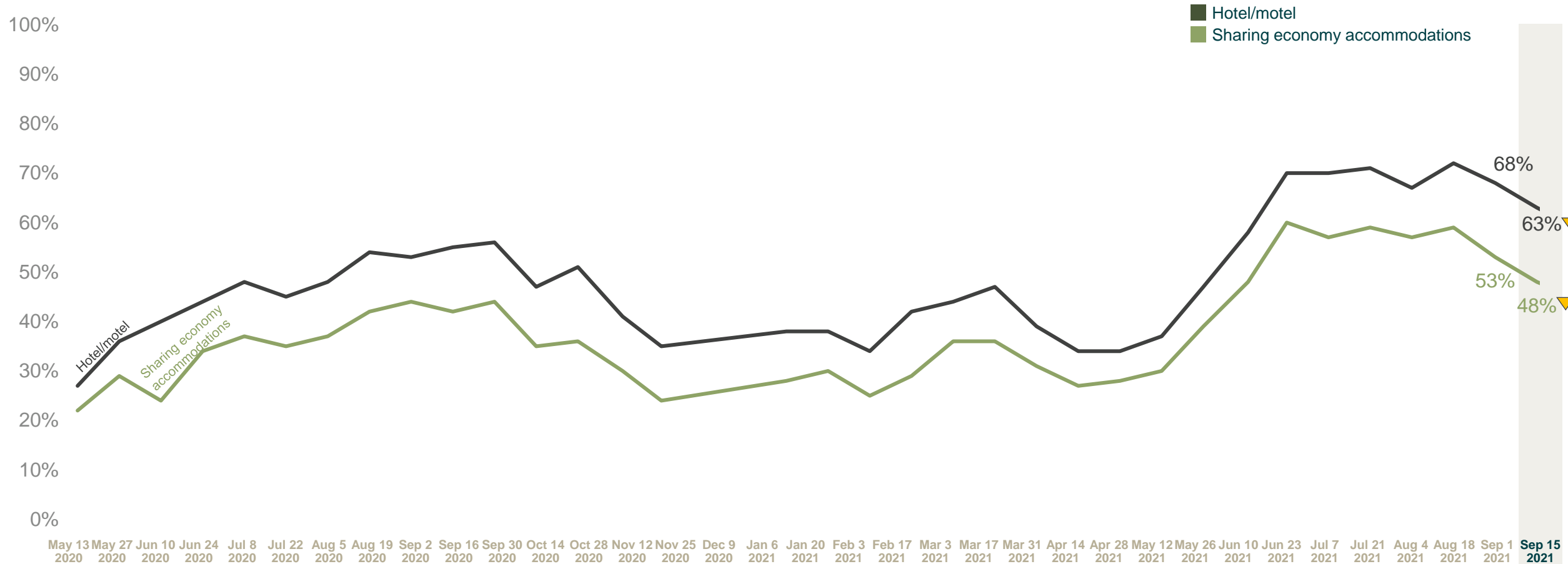

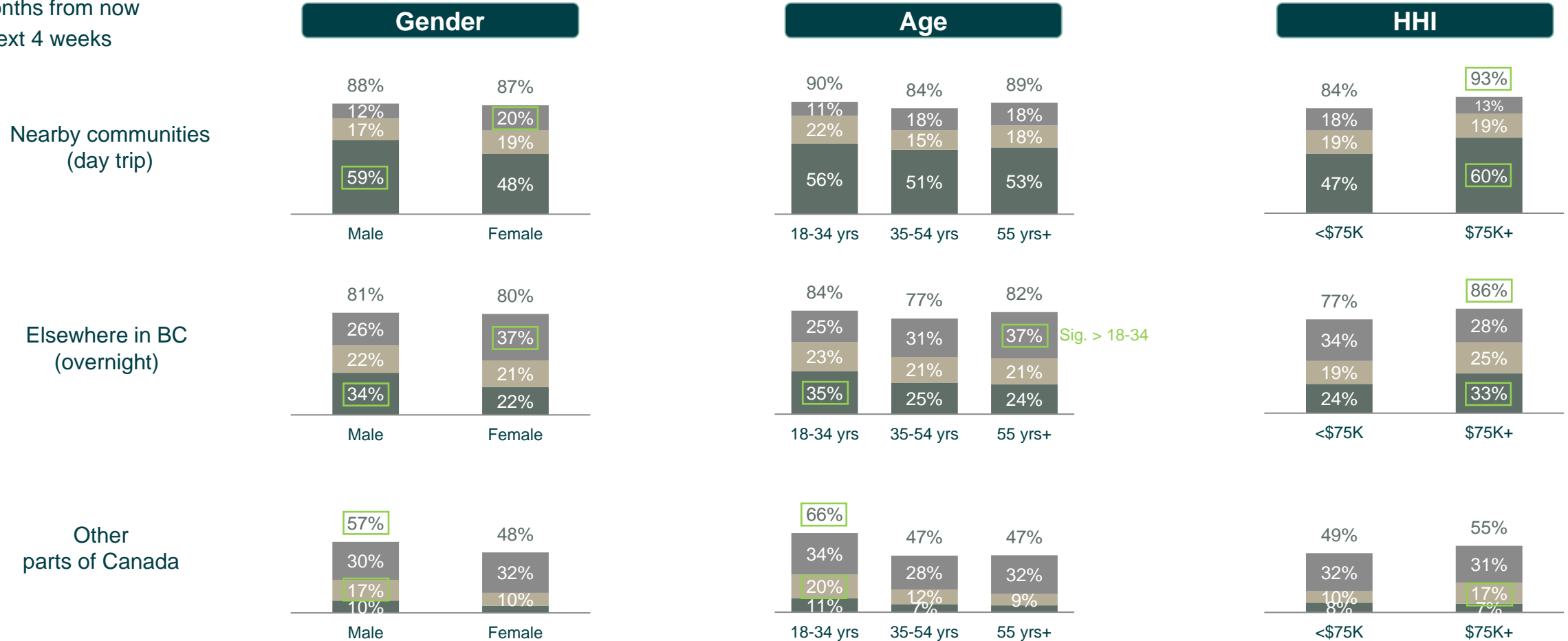

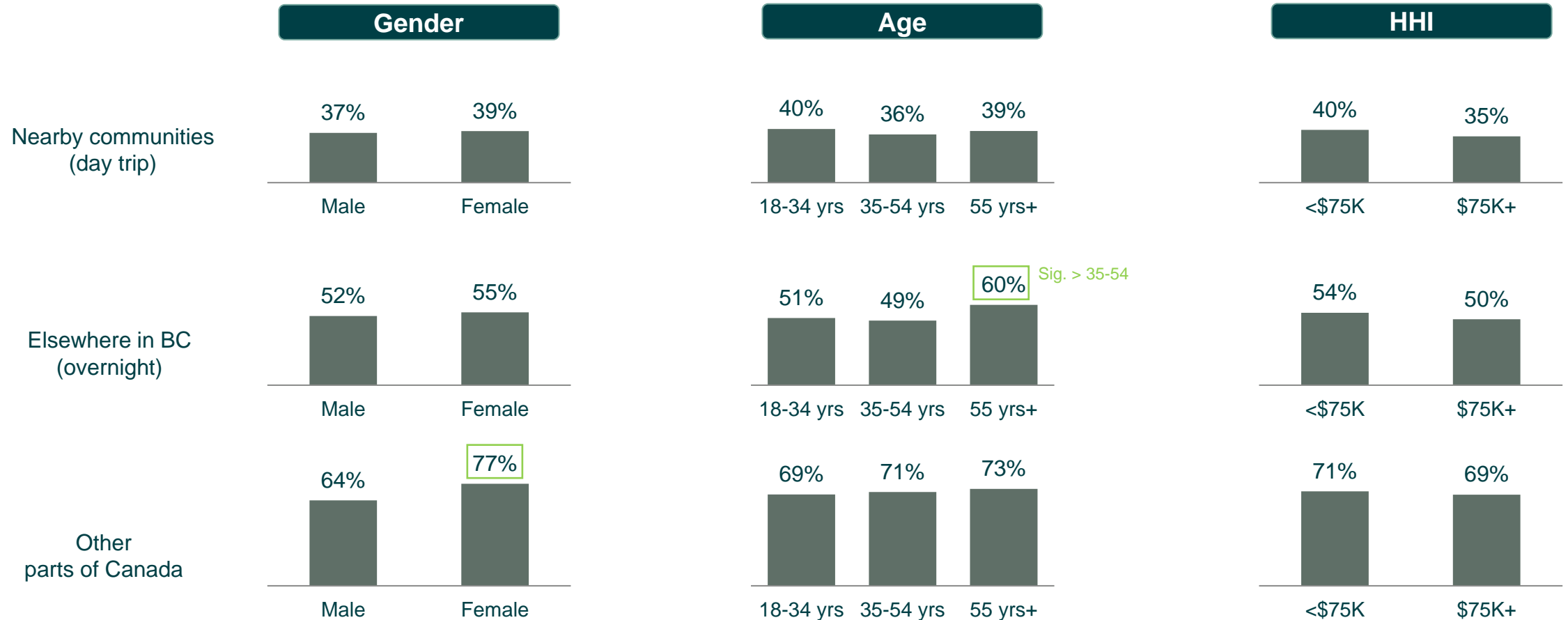

(Total Very/Somewhat Concerned, Wave 35 – Sept 15, 2021)

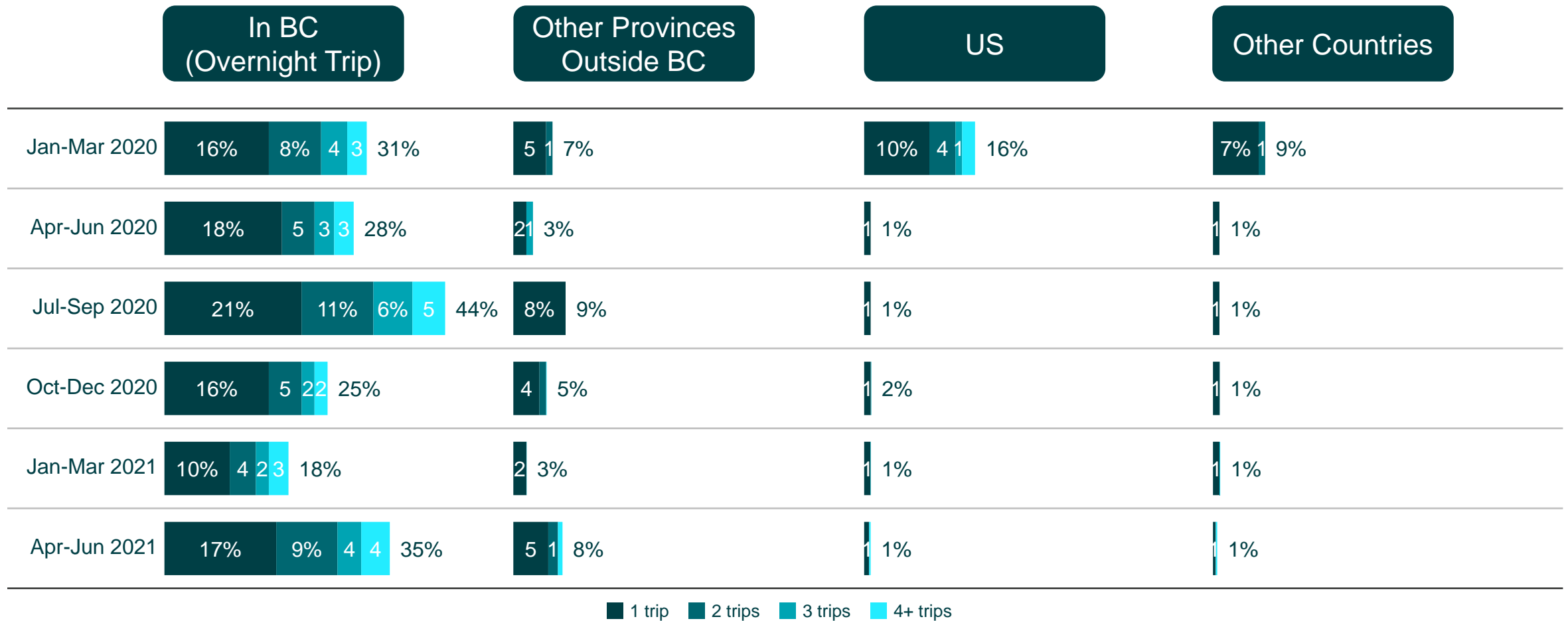

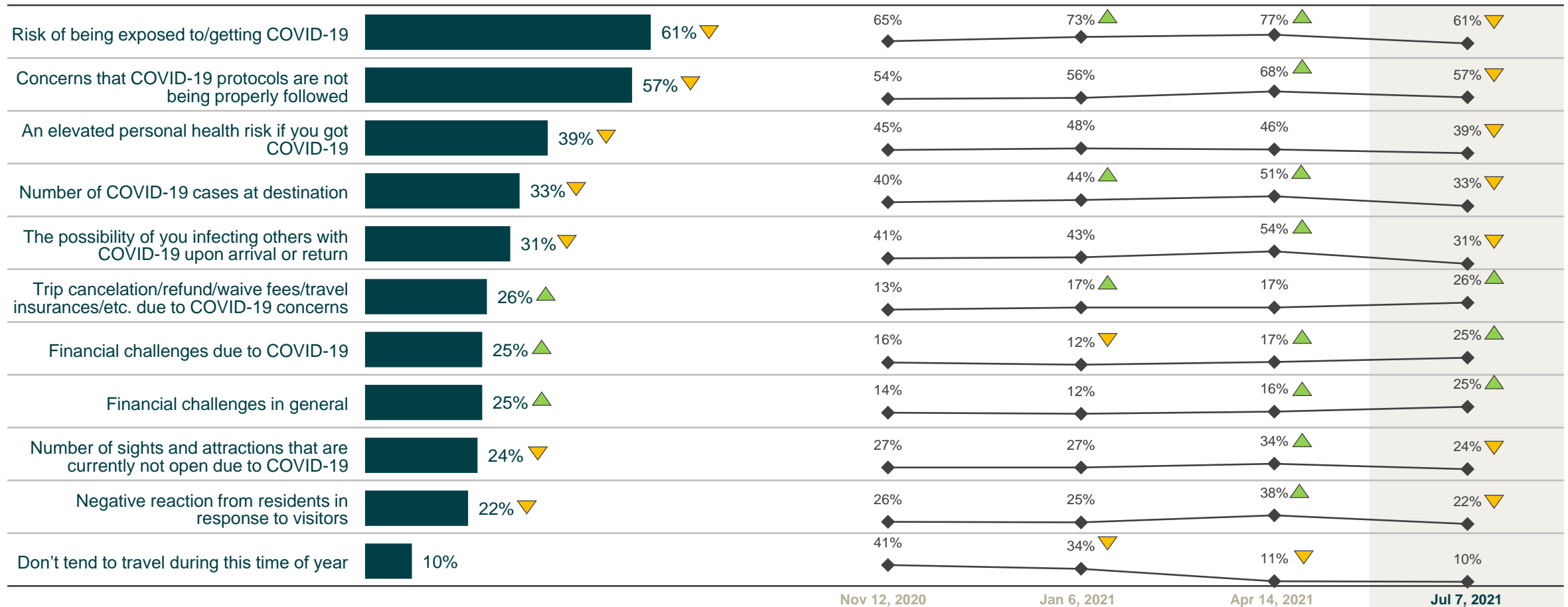
Reasons For Not Considering Future BC Travel (Aided)

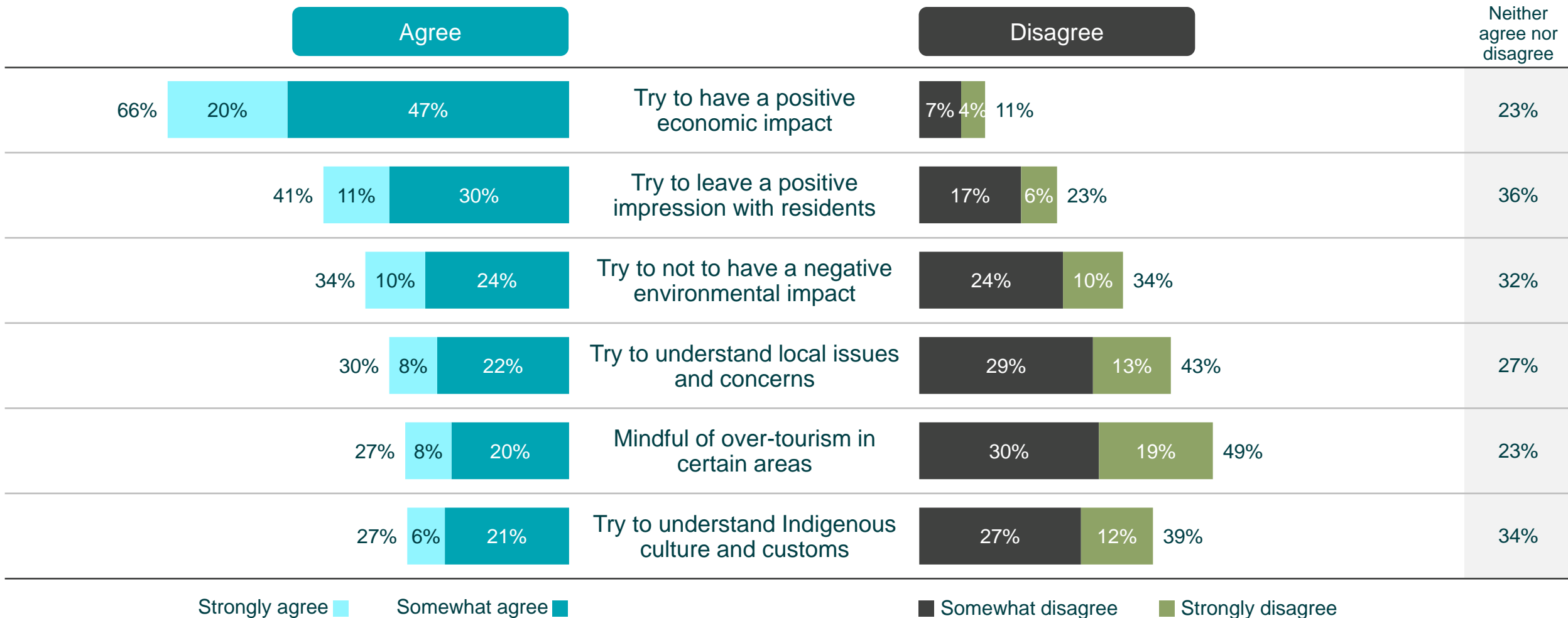

(Wave 32 – August 4, 2021)



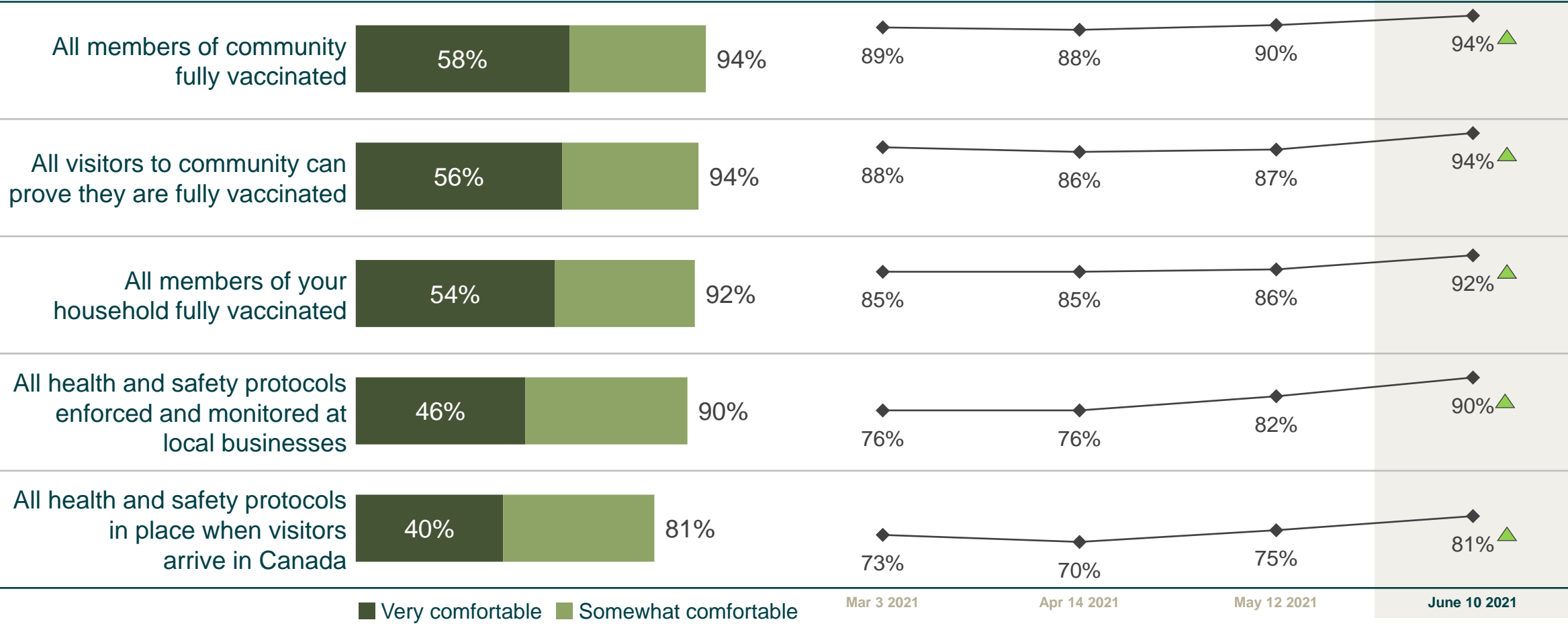

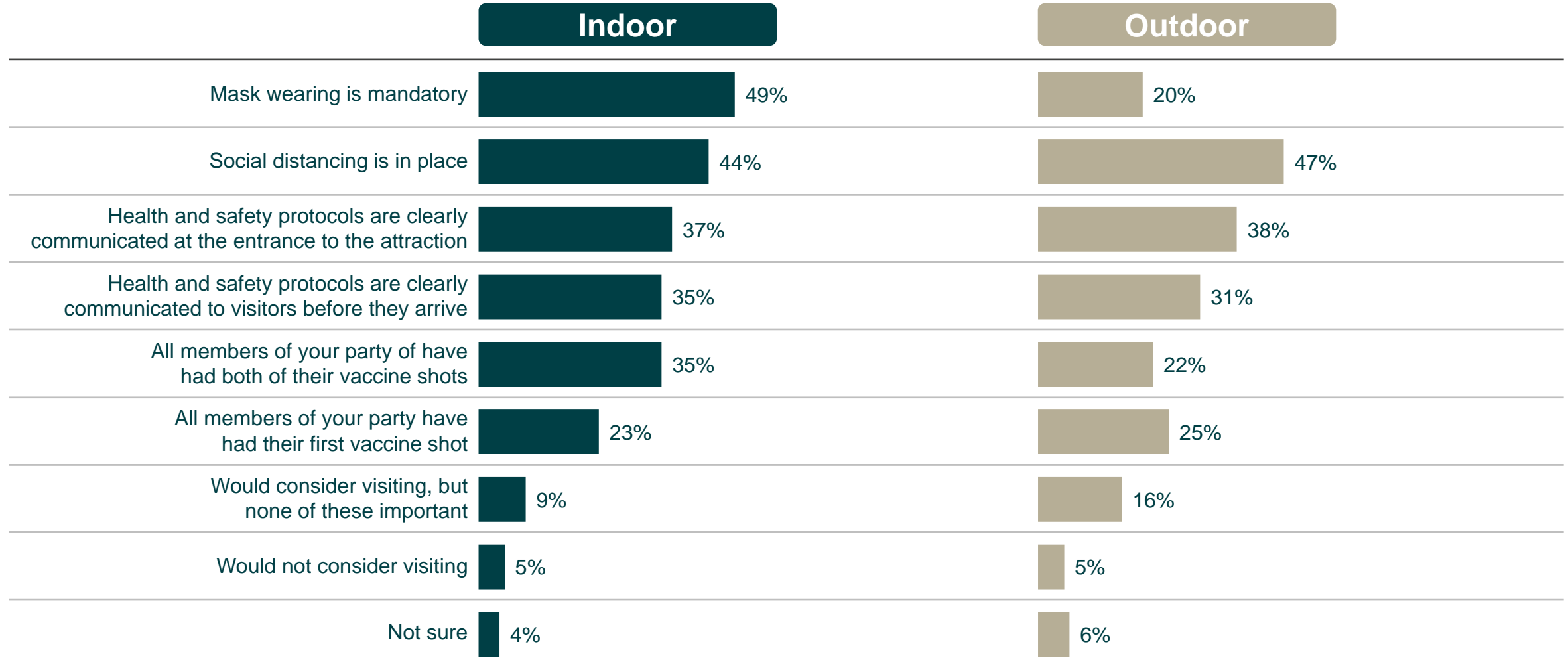

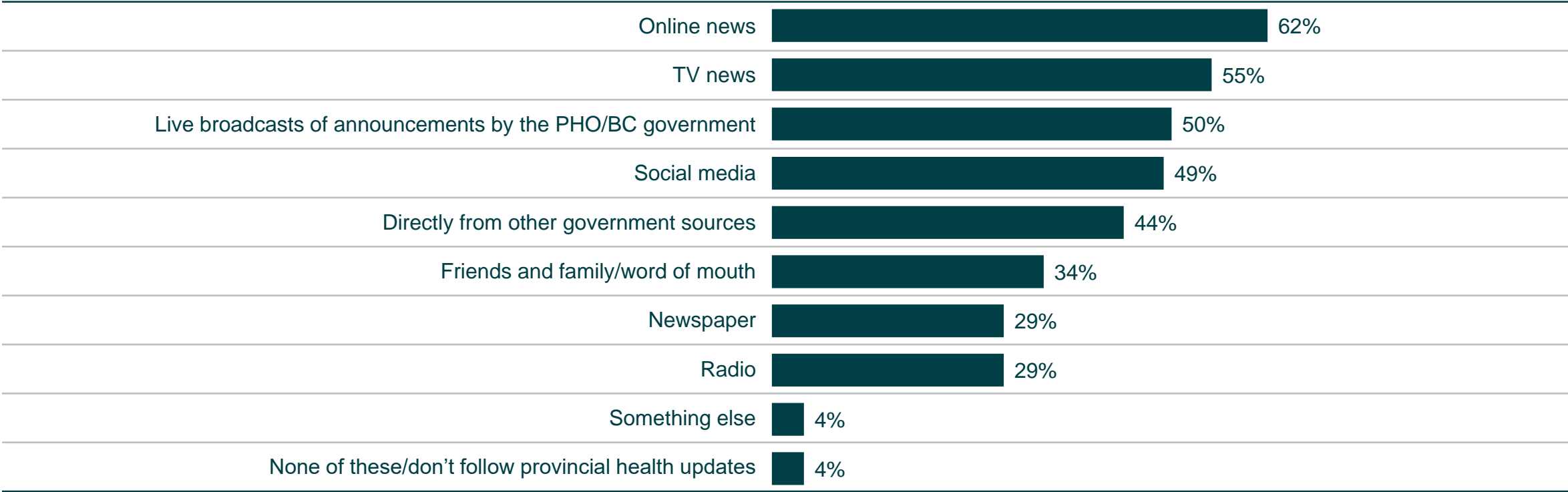

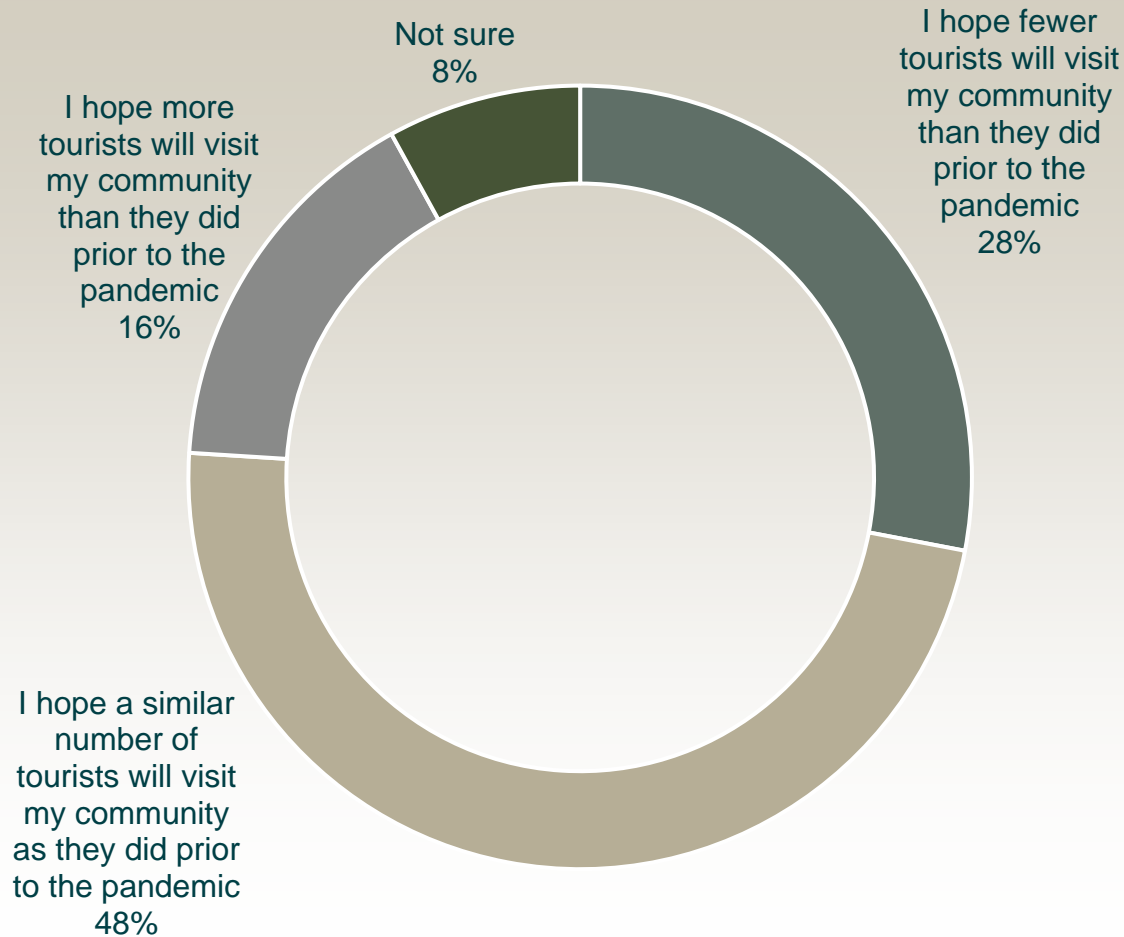

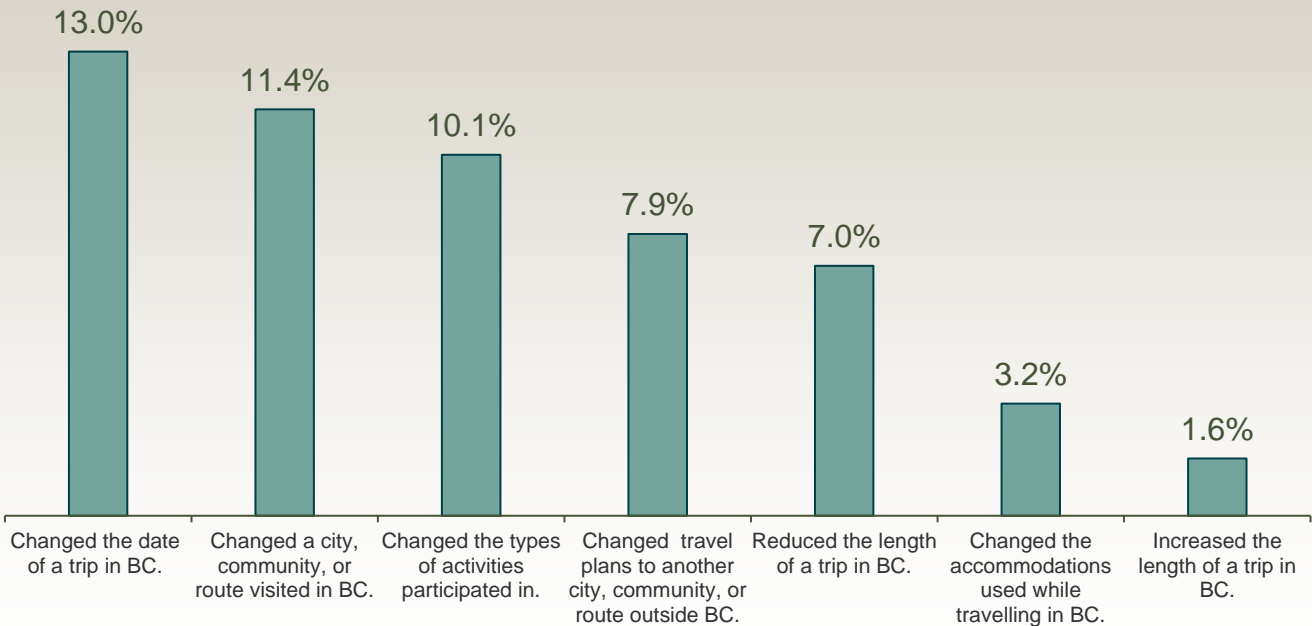
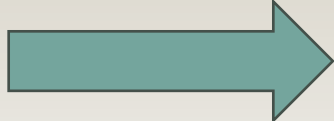
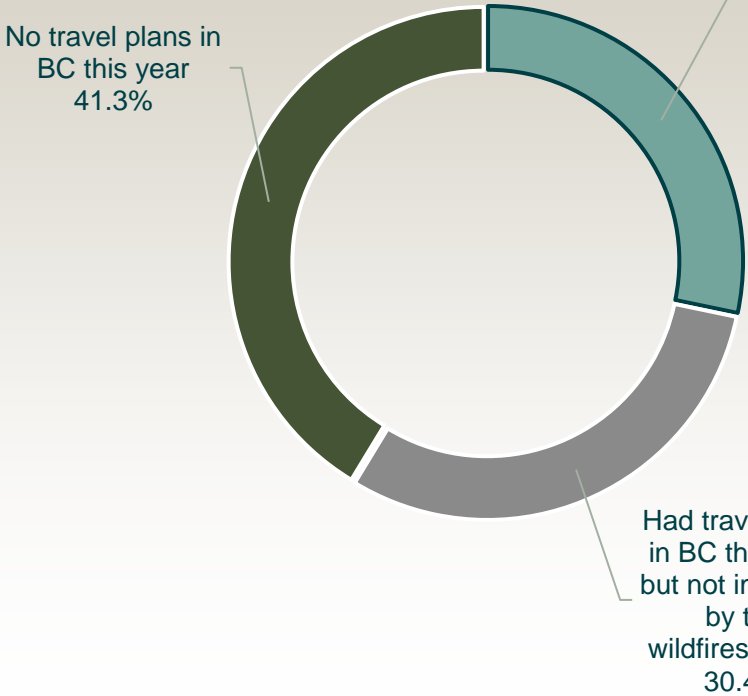
Impact Of Wildfires/Smoke On Residents' BC Travel Plans
